Judgo A. C. Finney granted an application for a writ of habeas corpus hearing in the case of Octaviano Moran in superior court, department two, vesterday after-noon. The date of the hearing was set down for Thursday, July 14, at | 10 A. M.

According to the affidavit filed in the case the defendant is charged with having immoral relations with, a girl, aged 17. It holds that an effort was made by attorney's for the defendant to have Moran surrender himself to the authorities at Calexico to answer to the charge, provided he would be released under. \$500 bond at once.

It is pointed out that this agreement was not satisfactory to the Calexico authorities and that they insisted on bail being fixed at \$1,-000. The attorney's for the defendant are said to have informed the court that this amount could not be obtained and intimated that Moran would not surrender himself.
